

## Salone de Mobile @ Milano Day 2.0

The Salone party is roughly built up in 3 parts in Milano. Of course the fair, you have the City Centre where the regular shops are combined with art & furniture and there is the Zona Tortona.

Day 2.0 was reserved for Tortona. A neighborhood located a bit southwest of Milano's city centre, all around Via Tortona. This is where art meets commerce, in a neighborhood of old warehouses, plants and production facilities, with an architectural 50-60's feeling.

Roughly there are 3 groups: Young and upcoming professionals, not able or not willing to pay the high booth rates. Cool, urban and trendy design brands that do not want to be seen in such a commercial area as the fair. And the final group: some major companies sowing their state of the art creative solutions.

One of the most innovative glass mosaic producers created a kind of church & bathroom feeling in an old warehouse. Our Italian friend displayed a dark but a gorgeous feeling.

Next steps, Moooi, Linteloo & Modular; 2 Dutch & 1 Belgium companies have a permanent showroom @ Via Tortona, all in a building designed by Paolo Navaro.
